# Monday

4. Beginning with verse 5, list one promised result of their restoration from each verse.
5. As you progress on your life marathon for the “gold,” what is one path you must take (8)? Why is this virtue so important?

# Tuesday

Acts 14:8–20

1. Try and describe what it would be like for you if people were throwing rocks in hopes of ending your life.
2. At first, the people considered Paul and Barnabas gods. What changed their mind?
3. Who helped Paul recover?
4. What happened the next day?
5. Is there someone you could help get back on their quest for the “gold” (physically, emotionally, or spiritually)? What would be a good way to get started?

# Wednesday

Proverbs 4:20–27

1. What is the writer emphasizing in verses 20–22?
2. List each life issue he presents in verses 23–27.
3. Which of these issues do you feel is most important for you in terms of maintaining a “go for the gold” mindset?
4. Which one is the most troublesome for you right now? What can you do to remedy it and how long do you think that might take?
5. Does verse 18 encourage you to stay on the right path? Why or why not?

Mark 10:35–45

1. How do you define “indignant”?
2. Why were the other disciples so upset with James and John?
3. How did Jesus respond to the sons of Zebedee?
4. What lesson did he teach the whole group?
5. Have you experienced similar hurt or angry feelings toward someone? How did you respond? What would Jesus say to you?
